2025 Fourth Quarter Utility Bills

The 2025 fourth quarter utility bills will arive in mail boxes in early November and are **due December 31, 2025**. To avoid a **2.5% penalty for late payments**, please ensure your payment is submitted on time.

Payment Options:

- 1. Mail: Send your payment to City Hall.
- 2. **Drop Box:** Use the secure drop box on City Hall's front steps.
- 3. **Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT):** Through your financial institution (allow 3 business days for processing).
- 4. E-Transfer: Send to finance.greenwoodcity@shaw.ca.
 - Include your account number in the memo section to ensure proper processing.

Reminder: Burn Barrels Are Not Allowed

A friendly reminder to all residents: burn barrels of any kind are not permitted within the City of Greenwood limits.

If you plan to have an open-air fire, you must first obtain a Burn Permit.

- Permits are free of charge
- Valid for 7 days
- Available at City Hall, 202 South Government Avenue

Halloween Safety

Halloween is just around the corner! Whether you're handing out treats, dressing up, or heading to a community event, a little preparation helps keep everyone safe and happy.

Trick-or-Treating Safety Tips:

- Carry a flashlight, glow stick, or reflective tape so you're visible to drivers.
- Walk on sidewalks where possible and cross at corners.
- Make sure costumes are easy to see and don't obstruct vision.
- Young children should be accompanied by an adult.
- Inspect treats before eating and discard anything unwrapped.

Drivers, Please Slow Down:

Expect increased pedestrian traffic on October 31st, especially between 4-9 p.m.

Home Safety for Halloween:

- Keep pathways clear of decorations to avoid trips and falls.
- Use battery-operated candles instead of open flames in pumpkins.
- Secure pets indoors to prevent escapes or stress from visitors.



We all know winter can be hard on our homes. When the temperature drops, the heat goes on — and that calls for extra precautions. Here are some tips to help you reduce and prevent unexpected issues this winter season:

Outside Your Home

- Clear leaves and debris from gutters and downspouts to prevent ice dams.
- Check your roof for loose or damaged shingles.
- Disconnect and store garden hoses; shut off and drain exterior water taps.
- Trim overhanging branches that could break under heavy snow or ice.
- Make sure snow shovels and ice melt are on hand before the first storm.

Inside Your Home

- Test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and replace batteries if needed.
- Inspect and clean chimneys and heating systems before use.
- Keep space heaters on flat, stable surfaces and away from flammable items.
- Know where your main water shutoff valve is in case of frozen pipes.
- Add weather stripping around doors and windows to conserve heat and reduce energy bills.

Taking these small steps now can help prevent costly repairs and keep your household safe and comfortable all season long.

Update: West Kootenay Power Building

After much discussion, City Council has made the difficult decision to sell the historic West Kootenay Power building. Despite years of exploring restoration and partnership options—including work with the Greenwood Historical Society—the City's limited budget and responsibility for other heritage sites made it impossible to take on the project alone. Council hopes a private buyer will have the vision and means to revitalize this important piece of Greenwood's history.

Public Process & Next Steps:

- Sept. 24 Oct. 2: Public notice of intent to sell will run for two weeks (Grand Forks Gazette, City website, social media). Written submissions can be sent to the CAO.
- Oct. 6 at 7 p.m.: Special Council Meeting. Staff will present public feedback, and the Municipal Land Sale Bylaw will receive its first three readings (public may attend and speak during Q&A).
- Oct. 14: Final Council reading of the bylaw (another opportunity for public input).
- Oct. 15: If approved, the property will be listed for sale.

This process follows all legal requirements under the Community Charter and the City's land disposition policy.

Fire Prevention Week: October 5-11, 2025

This year's theme, "Charge into Fire Safety™: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home," highlights the growing fire risks associated with lithium-ion batteries found in everyday devices like smartphones, laptops, e-bikes, and power tools.

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) is focusing on educating the public about the safe use, storage, and disposal of these batteries to prevent potential hazards. NFPA

Key Safety Tips:

- Purchase Wisely: Only buy devices with lithium-ion batteries that are listed by a recognized testing laboratory, ensuring they meet established safety standards. ANSI
- Charge Safely: Use the original charging cables and adapters provided with your device. Avoid overcharging and never charge devices on soft surfaces like beds or couches.
- Dispose Properly: Recycle old or damaged batteries at designated recycling centers. Do not throw them in the trash.
- Store Correctly: Keep batteries in a cool, dry place, away from direct sunlight and heat sources.

Let's do our part to protect our streets, our neighbours, and our bears.






Pool Update - Exciting Changes Underway!
