2025 Tax Sale - Important Notice

Property owners are reminded that **ALL delinquent property taxes must be paid in full prior to the tax sale date** to avoid their property being included in the sale.

2025 Third Quarter Utility Bills

The 2025 Third quarter utility bills will arive in mail boxes in early August and are **due September 30, 2025**. To avoid a **2.5% penalty for late payments**, please ensure your payment is submitted on time.

Payment Options:

- 1. Mail: Send your payment to City Hall.
- 2. **Drop Box:** Use the secure drop box on City Hall's front steps.
- 3. **Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT):** Through your financial institution (allow 3 business days for processing).
- 4. E-Transfer: Send to finance.greenwoodcity@shaw.ca.
 - Include your account number in the memo section to ensure proper processing.



Stage 2 Water Restrictions Now in Effect

Future changes to water restrictions will be posted to the website, facebook and posted around town

To help conserve our water supply, the City of Greenwood is now under **Stage 2 Water Restrictions**. Please review the guidelines below to ensure compliance:

Days of Watering

Even-numbered addresses may water on Saturdays and Tuesdays

Odd-numbered addresses may water on Sundays and Wednesdays

Automatic Sprinkler Systems

If your property has an automated sprinkler system, you may water only between 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on your designated watering days.

Manual Sprinklers & Hose-Connected Systems

Manually controlled sprinklers (including hoses connected to outdoor taps) may be used only between 12:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. – 12:00 a.m. on your designated watering days.


Prohibitions

No person shall waste water by using more water than is required, including but not limited to, allowing a tap or hose to run water unnecessarily or over-watering plants, lawns, and agricultural parcels.

<u>Maintenance - Adjacent Areas Reminder Maintenance - Adjacent Areas Reminder - Adjacent - Adj</u>

The City of Greenwood would like to remind all property owners and occupiers of their responsibility to maintain the areas adjacent to their properties, as outlined in Section 7.3 of Good Neighbour Bylaw No. 1013-2024.

This includes ensuring that lanes, sidewalks, boulevards, and any other land adjacent to your property are properly maintained. Specifically, property owners and occupiers are required to:

- Remove accumulations of filth, leaves, rubbish, discarded materials, and hazardous objects, especially those obstructing any drainage facilities
- · Maintain grass areas to a reasonable standard consistent with the surrounding area, and keep them free of weeds
- Keep all driveway crossings in good repair and up to City standards
- Trim and maintain all plantings adjacent to the property
- Ensure all lanes, boulevards, and sidewalks are kept clear of debris
- Maintain a 1-metre radius around fire hydrants, including a clear 1-metre path from the hydrant to the nearest roadway, free of snow, ice, or other obstructions.

These requirements help maintain community safety, accessibility, and overall appearance. For questions or clarification regarding bylaw compliance, please contact City Hall.

BIG NEWS from the Greenwood Volunteer Fire Department!

We're thrilled to announce that Mayor and Council have approved the purchase of a new fire truck — a 2018 Sutphen International Commercial Pumper with a 1,200-gallon water holding capacity! This shiny beast will be replacing our reliable but very tired 1980 International - Engine 342 — thank you for your decades of service! With growing concerns about both structural and wildland fires, this upgrade is a major step forward in boosting our emergency response for the City of Greenwood and surrounding area.

Even better? Based on current BC standards, this new pumper will be serving our community for the next 23 years! That's over two decades of enhanced fire protection!

Tity of Greenwood Opting Out of RDKB Animal Control Services

- ★ The City of Greenwood has made the decision to opt out of the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary's (RDKB) Animal Control services. This decision was made after careful consideration of several key factors.
 - First and foremost, the public expects timely and effective responses to nuisance complaints and instances of dogs-at-large.

 Unfortunately, the current service has not consistently met these expectations.
- Secondly, the communication and reporting mechanisms for both filed and active cases have been significantly lacking. This has created ongoing challenges for City administration and has, in turn, affected the residents of Greenwood.
- Lastly, there are jurisdictional limitations regarding the authority of the RDKB in addressing cases involving aggressive or dangerous dogs. These limitations—when compared to the authority held by the Province—hinder the effectiveness of enforcement and resolution.
 - The City Council believes that the current service does not adequately meet the needs of our community. In a time when financial resources are limited, it is critical that taxpayer dollars are spent on services that provide tangible value. If a service fails to meet expectations, those funds are better kept in the taxpayers' pockets.
 - † The RDKB Areas C/D as well as the City of Grand Forks have also opted out of the RDKB animal control services.
- 💖 The City remains committed to exploring more effective and responsive solutions for animal control that better serve our residents.
