2025 Third Quarter Utility Bills

The 2025 Third quarter utility bills are **due September 30, 2025**. To avoid a **2.5% penalty for late payments**, please ensure your payment is submitted on time.

Payment Options:

- 1. Mail: Send your payment to City Hall.
- 2. **Drop Box:** Use the secure drop box on City Hall's front steps.
- 3. **Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT):** Through your financial institution (allow 3 business days for processing).
- 4. E-Transfer: Send to finance.greenwoodcity@shaw.ca.
 - Include your account number in the memo section to ensure proper processing.

Fall is here, and that means bears are busy preparing for winter. The City of Greenwood encourages everyone to be Bear Wise and do their part to reduce human-bear conflicts.

Bear Wise Basics for Fall:

- 1. Keep garbage secured until collection day.
- 2. Pick ripe fruit promptly and clean up windfalls.
- 3. Do not leave pet food or bird seed outside.
- 4. Keep barbecues clean and free of food scraps.
- 5. Always keep dogs leashed—dogs and bears don't mix.

Greenwood is Rolling Forward!

Council has approved the development of a 3-Year Fleet Replacement Strategy to be presented at the September Committee of the Whole.

Did you know? The average age of our Public Works fleet is 24.5 years old — compared to the provincial average of 8–11 years for similar communities. That's a lot of years of hard work!

By upgrading our fleet, we can:

- Improve lawn maintenance, street sweeping, snow removal, fire protection, and more
- Reduce costly repairs & downtime
- Save on fuel and boost efficiency

The first step? Create a plan to retire "end of life" equipment and replace it with modern, reliable machines — all within our existing budgets over the next 3 years.

We've already started! Recent purchases include:

- A new commercial mower
- A medium tractor (loader/snow plow)
- A fire engine/pumper
- A 1-ton utility truck with dump box

This is all part of our Asset Management Plan to keep Greenwood running smoothly and looking its best!

City of Greenwood has moved back to Stage 1 Water Restrictions

Future changes to water restrictions will be posted to the website, facebook and posted



The City of Greenwood has returned to Stage 1 Water Restrictions. Please help us conserve water by following these guidelines:

Days of Watering:

- Even-numbered addresses may water on even calendar days.
- Odd-numbered addresses may water on odd calendar days.

Watering Hours:

- Automated sprinkler systems: 12:00 midnight 6:00 am (on your permitted days).
- Manual sprinkling systems (including hoses attached to outdoor taps): 12:00 midnight 11:00 am and 6:00 pm – 12:00 midnight (on your permitted days).

Thank you for doing your part to support sustainable water use in our community!

Fall Yard Waste & Fire Safety Reminder

As the leaves begin to fall, please remember that yard waste should not be burned without a valid Burn Permit.

Within the City of Greenwood, Burn Permits are required. They are free of charge, valid for 7 days from the date of issue, and can be obtained at City Hall, 202 South Government St.

A few important reminders:

- 1. No burn barrels are permitted within city limits.
- 2. Open burning can quickly get out of control, especially in dry fall conditions, and smoke impacts community air quality
- 3. Safer alternatives include raking and collecting leaves to take to the dump, composting, or using leaves as mulch in your garden.
- 4. Keep gutters and roofs clear of leaves to reduce fire risk and prevent drainage problems.

Building a Safer, More Prepared Greenwood

The City of Greenwood is taking important steps to strengthen our emergency preparedness. We've brought on Chris Marsh as our consultant for Phase 1 of this project. This first phase will focus on a Gap Analysis — a detailed review of our current emergency plan, services, infrastructure, and processes.

This analysis will help us identify:

- Areas that need improvement
- Communication upgrades
- · Stronger coordination with the RDKB
- Better infrastructure mapping
- Opportunities for community education

Why does this matter? A strong emergency plan means faster response times, clearer communication, and a safer community for everyone.

The results of this Gap Analysis will lay the groundwork for Phase 2 – updating Greenwood's emergency plan to reflect local risks and needs.

🔥 Town Hall – Understanding Fire Protection In Greenwood🆖

The City of Greenwood will be holding an important **Town Hall** on **Wednesday, October 29, 2025, at 7:00 pm** at the **McArthur Centre**, 1355 Veterans Lane. This session, hosted by **Tim Pley & Associates**, is designed to give residents a clear picture of what it truly takes to operate and sustain a fire department in our community.

Many people assume that when an emergency happens, you call and the fire department simply arrives. But behind every call is a tremendous amount of preparation, commitment, and resources. Running a fire department requires careful planning, ongoing training, and significant financial investment. At this Town Hall, we'll take a closer look at:

- 1. **Recruitment & Training** Volunteer firefighters dedicate countless hours to intensive training in fire suppression, medical response, rescue techniques, and safety procedures.
- 2. **Equipment & Gear** From fire trucks to hoses, breathing apparatus, and protective clothing, specialized equipment must be maintained and replaced regularly to meet safety standards.
- 3. **Costs & Budgeting** Fire protection is one of the largest responsibilities a municipality carries. Residents will learn where the money goes and why proper funding is essential to effective emergency response.
- 4. **Provincial Requirements** Our fire department must meet strict standards under the Fire Safety Act and comply with regulations set by the Province of BC.
- 5. Fire Inspections & Investigations Fire protection doesn't end with emergency calls. Inspections, investigations, and prevention programs all contribute to keeping our community safe.
- 6. **The Role of Volunteers** Greenwood's fire protection relies on community members who step up as volunteers, balancing their personal lives with the responsibility of protecting their neighbours.

This Town Hall is an opportunity for residents to understand the full scope of fire protection—what happens behind the scenes, the challenges we face, and the dedication required to keep Greenwood safe.
